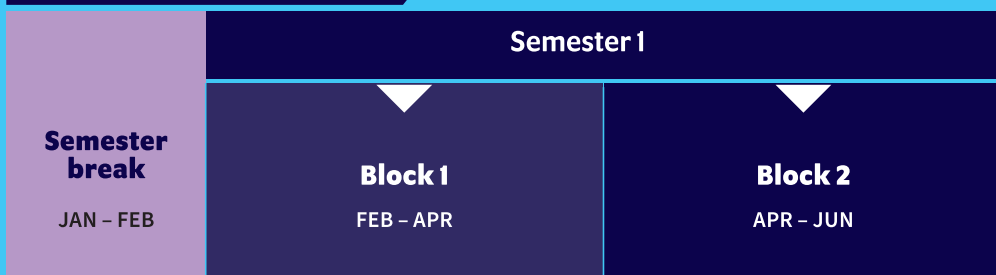

Studying at VU Sydney or Brisbane, you will enjoy the endless opportunities and enviable lifestyle of two of the nation's biggest and brightest cities. Both Sydney and Brisbane have extensive and reliable public transport networks, meaning you can easily travel around the cities, including to VU campuses.

With a strong job market across a variety of industries, both locations offer great opportunities to support your studies through part-time work and gain valuable postgraduate work experience.



Work opportunities

Sydney and Brisbane offer a wealth of employment opportunities across various industries, from casual work like retail, hospitality and customer service to graduate positions in technology, education and so much more. They're both perfect places to get international work experience, develop new skills and kick-start your career.

Before applying for jobs, check in with our VU Careers Hub team to get the best advice, including interview practice, access to our online job search and information about work rights. Australia has strong regulations to protect the rights of all workers, including international students. The current minimum wage is \$24.95 per hour, but check the website below for updates and further details.

While you study

Many international students choose to work while living and studying in Sydney or Brisbane. An Australian Student visa (subclass 500) allows you to work part-time up to 48 hours per fortnight, and full-time during semester breaks. Working part-time is a great way to support yourself, develop skills and meet new people. The VU Block Model teaching method offers focused and flexible timetables to help you balance study with work.

As an international student, you are required to maintain course enrolment and ensure satisfactory attendance and progress. We strongly advise you to keep up to date about any changes to your visa conditions, including work rights, such as the number of hours you are permitted to work.

After you graduate

If you're interested in staying in Australia to work after you graduate, you'll need to get a relevant working visa before your student visa expires. There are two options available to you under the Temporary Graduate visa (subclass 485): the Post-Higher Education Work stream and the Post-Vocational Education Work stream.

The qualification you use to meet the Australian study requirement determines the stream you can apply for. Both visas let you live, study and work in Australia for a temporary period of time. Please note that the maximum eligible age for a Temporary Graduate visa is 35 years or under at the time of application.

Fees and living costs

Before you start your studies, it's a great idea to prepare a budget based on your lifestyle and accommodation choices. These pages offer an indication of some of the main expenses of studying and living in Australia.

Tuition fees

Your tuition fees will be outlined in your offer letter. You will need to pay a tuition fee deposit to accept your offer. After you commence your course, you will be invoiced for each unit (subject) before it starts. Tuition fees vary by course and may change.

Study costs

You may need to buy equipment, textbooks or other materials for your course. These costs are separate from your tuition fees. Allow approximately A\$650 for books and stationery each year, plus any compulsory equipment.

Payment plan

At VU Sydney and Brisbane, we provide a flexible unit-by-unit payment plan, allowing you to manage your fees progressively as you advance through your course. Instead of paying the full semester fee upfront, you can make convenient, regular instalments for each unit.

Living costs

As a condition of your student visa you must have enough money to pay the first year costs of your stay, including your travel and living expenses. As of May 2024, the Australian Government expects all new international students to have A\$29,710 in savings, with further funds available for any accompanying relatives. See the student visa application details on the Department of Home Affairs website for further details.

Accommodation

We recommend booking accommodation before you arrive in Australia, at least for the first few weeks. There are many options including homestays, share houses, private rentals and private rooms.

The preferred homestay provider for VU Sydney and Brisbane is the Australian Homestay Network (AHN). Students staying with AHN are covered by insurance and have access to 24/7 emergency phone support. The minimum stay is four weeks.

Health insurance

You must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) to obtain a student visa. Victoria University can arrange your OSHC for you, which gives you extra benefits over any policy that you can purchase directly. If you would like us to organise cover for you, it will be through Allianz Care Australia, our preferred insurance provider.

Refund policy

If special or exceptional circumstances prevent you from continuing your studies, you may be eligible for a full or partial refund. If you need to discontinue your course and seek a refund, you must supply documentary evidence in support of your application.

Course description

The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (EBEC) is a comprehensive program designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills necessary to excel in the field of early childhood education.

With a duration of three years, this course prepares students for a rewarding career nurturing the development and wellbeing of children from birth to five years.

This course will help you to build a strong sense of social justice, understand child development in the early years and develop ethical professional teaching practice that includes Indigenous perspectives.

Course description

The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education and Leadership (EBCL) is for those aspiring to take on leadership roles in early childhood education.

This course builds on our three-year Bachelor of Early Childhood Education with a fourth year dedicated to gaining an in-depth understanding of leadership skills, play-based education, global perspectives and education policy.

A key focus of your fourth year will be a research inquiry project on a topic of your choice relating to early childhood education.

Graduate outcomes

With this nationally accredited degree, you can work around Australia and take on leadership roles in public or private kindergartens, long day care centres, and policy development with government bodies.

With strong growth expected for both early childhood teachers and child care centre managers, you can expect to earn above-average wages while enjoying the rewards that come with nurturing the next generation.

Course description

The Graduate Diploma is designed for students who have a bachelor degree in any discipline aside from early childhood education. You'll learn all about child development, curriculum planning and different teaching strategies.

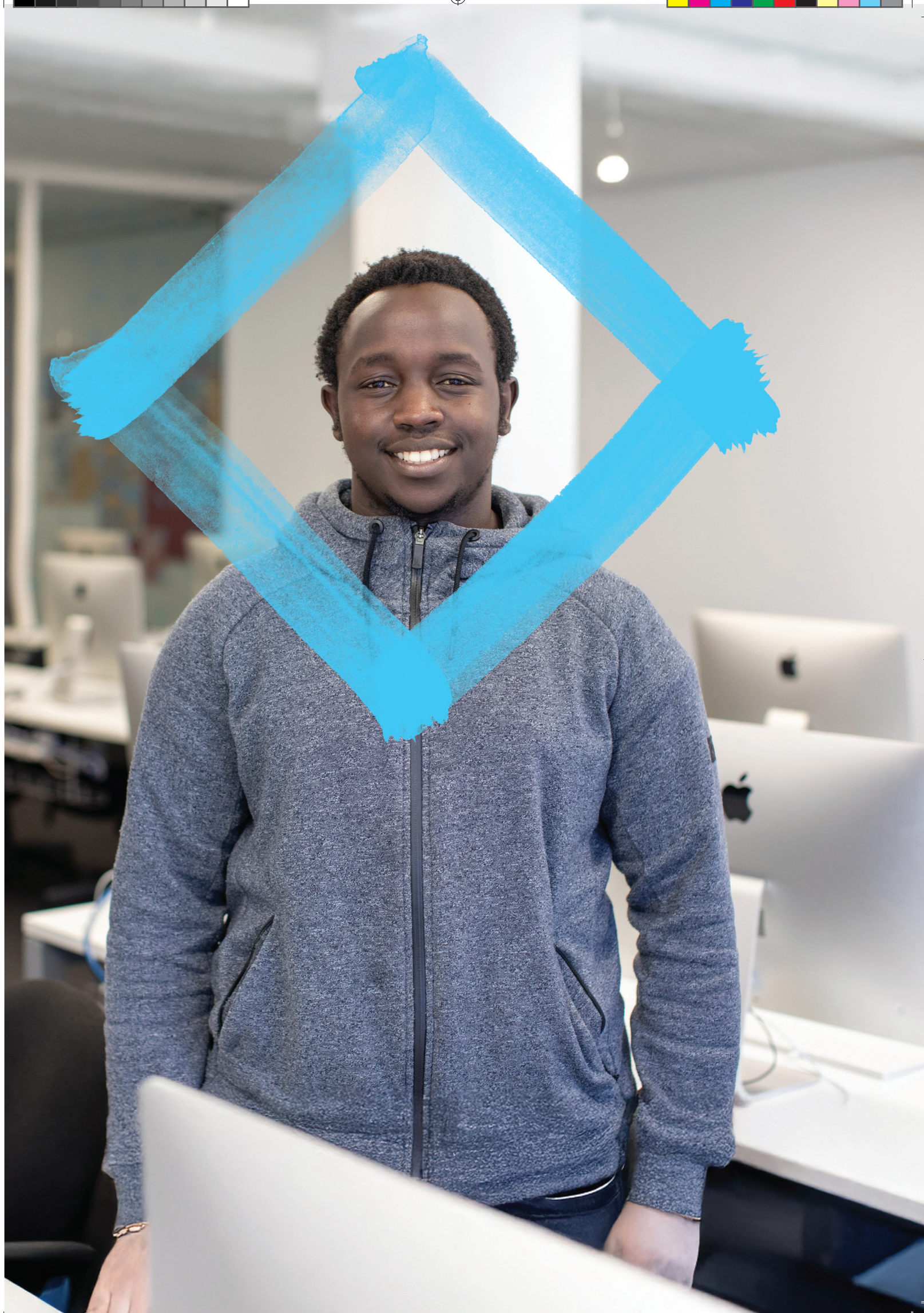

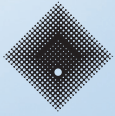
