## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### General Entry Requirements

Admission to this course requires qualifications equivalent to an Australian bachelor degree.

To be eligible for an offer, you must have:

- A completed AQF7 Bachelor Degree or above, or approved equivalent, majoring in a business, management and/or health and social care related disciplines; or
- A completed AQF7 Bachelor Degree or above, or approved equivalent, in an unrelated discipline plus a minimum of two years relevant work experience in the health and social care sector.

### English Language Requirements

This degree requires an IELTS (Academic) of 6.5, with no individual band less than 6.0.

For students who do not meet the English Language Requirement through citizenship or prior studies in English in an approved country, evidence of an approved English language test completed within the last 2 years must be provided.
